

Pupil Premium Grant Allocation and Impact 2015/16

Pupil premium was introduced in 2011. The funding is intended to help disadvantaged pupils to 'close the gap' and to raise attainment and improve progress. All students identified as being in the Pupil Premium cohort will benefit from additional academic support and encouragement to ensure they have a positive and successful learning experience.

Children eligible include:

- Pupils who have been registered for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years
- Children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months
- Children of armed forces personnel.
